

Range Rules August 1, 2016

General Range Rules

- No alcoholic beverages or controlled substances may be used or consumed on the Club ranges before or while shooting.
 - Bottles and cans shall not be used as targets.
 - Shooters must clean up their trash after shooting.
- Bolts and actions of firearms brought onto Club premises must be open at all times except when on the firing line. Shooters are expected to control the muzzle of any firearm they are carrying on the premises. Firearms are to be discharged only in a safe manner when the range is clear and shooters are responsible for determining that they are firing into an adequate backstop.
- No Club building, fixture, equipment, fence, gate lock or other property shall be destroyed or damaged willfully or intentionally.
- Gate keys shall not be loaned nor shall they be duplicated and-or loaned to non-members.
- Motor vehicles shall not be used in such a manner as to cause harm or destruction to ranges, benches, fences or other Club property.
 - Failure to obey the rules of the Club may result in disqualification at a match or expulsion from the Club.
 - Shooters must be a Club member, guest of a member or competing in a match to use the Club ranges. No unaccompanied minors.

Alliance Rifle Club Ranges

Glen Fiebig Range is located eight miles east of Alliance, Nebraska on Highway 2. Hoffland Range is located ten miles east of Alliance, Nebraska on Highway 2.

Glen Fiebig Range

Opened July 2007 for the use of ARC members and their guests.

Follow the General Range Rules. Failure to obey club rules may result in expulsion from the club.

Gate Key: The Fiebig Range is for use of our members and guests that accompany club members. Keys are not to be loaned to non-club members. Please close and lock the gate when all shooters have left the range.

Safety: Safety is our highest priority when handling firearms. Always point the muzzle in a safe direction and be aware of other shooters. Make your firearm safe when going downrange to change targets, etc. Communicate with other shooters before proceeding downrange for target replacement.

ATV's: No unauthorized ATV's or motorcycles beyond the target berms. Erosion is a real issue with our range, so please stay on the roads.

Range Use: Fiebig Range has 25 yd. – 50 yd. – 100 yd. and 200 yd. shooting areas. Shooters are to engage the targets from the appropriate distances. Example is to shoot the 100 yd. target from the proper bench and not set target at 50 yd. line to obtain zero and then move out to the 100 or 200 yd. targets.

Shotguns: Use of shotguns is only allowed on the 100 yd. range.

Clean Range: We allow the use of bowling pins and water jugs as targets. Clay target shooting is allowed as long as you do not interfere with other shooters and do not shoot or throw targets on our neighbor's property. Trash cans and dumpsters are provided throughout the facility. A push broom has been provided to clean up brass and debris on the 100 and 200 yd. concrete firing lines.

Sight in Day: The club has a sight in day before deer season that allows the general public to sight in their rifles and handguns. Date for sight in day will be advertised in the local paper, on the ARC website and Facebook page.

Hoffland Range

Hoffland Range is an outdoor shooting range located about 10 miles east of Alliance on Highway 2. This range is for use for organized Club matches. It is a closed range and is to used only on designated practice days or with the knowledge of one of the Officers or Directors of the Alliance Rifle Club.

Follow the General Range Rules. Failure to obey club rules may result in expulsion from the club.

Key: If a member of the Club wishes to use the range for practice, they <u>MUST</u> get a key from an Officer or Director. Range is for the use of ARC members only. A member of the Club must accompany non-members. Only members of the Board of Directors or approved members are to have keys to Hoffland.

Gate: Club members and shooters on the range are to use the Club Gate. Do not use the private gate east of our gate. Be sure gate is closed at all times except when Club matches are in progress.

Practice Days: The Club will arrange and announce some Practice Days when the range will be open for practice and sighting in. It will be supervised by at least one member of the Board.

Range Flag (stored in the South Box Car):
The orange shooting flag MUST be displayed on the south flag pole on top of the hill ANY
TIME members are shooting at the range. This will let our neighbors know we are using the range. When the range is secured for the day, the flag will be returned to the South Box Car for storage.

Cattle and Cowboys: Watch for cattle and cowboys in pastures adjacent to our range. Cease fire until they are clear.
